



## C.S. Lewis



Clive Staples Lewis, commonly known as C.S. Lewis was born in Belfast, Ireland in 1898. He was a novelist, poet, lecturer and lay THEOLOGIAN - a person who has not received formal theological, or religious, training. He is best known for his fictional work, especially The Screwtape Letters, The Space Trilogy (which includes Out of the Silent Planet, Perelandra, and The HIDEOUS Strength) and The CHRONICLES of Narnia.

### C.S. Lewis

The Chronicles of Narnia is a series of seven FANTASY novels for children and is considered a classic of children's LITERATURE. Written between 1949 and 1954, the series has sold over 100 million copies and been translated into 47 different

languages. The Chronicles have been adapted, both complete or in excerpts, several times for radio, TV, the theatre or movies. Lewis found his inspiration from several sources when writing these books and explored themes not typically captured in children's literature such as religion, race and GENDER.

The Lion, the Witch and the WARDROBE was the first in the series, and although published in 1950 C. S. Lewis had actually begun piecing the story together long before that. The tales of ancient myths his Irish nurse told him always fascinated him; and when he was sixteen, a picture of a FAUN (a man with a goat's horns, ears, legs, and tail) carrying PARCELS and an umbrella in snowy woods popped into his head. Years later, during World War II, four children stayed with Lewis at his country house and stirred his imagination again. Not long afterward, he began writing the story that would become The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.

While writing, Lewis INCORPORATED creatures from myths along with his own memories—such as that of the old wardrobe\* from his childhood. As the children in his book found their way into



NARNIA, he was still unsure of what his complete story would be about. Then the image of ASLAN, the "Great Lion" came to him.

Lewis once said, "I don't know where the Lion came from or why he came. But once he was there, he pulled the whole story together." Aslan is the only character to appear through all seven books.

C.S. Lewis's early childhood was relatively happy and carefree. In those days Northern Ireland was not yet PLAGUED by bitter civil strife, and the Lewises were comfortably off. The family home, called LITTLE LEA, was a large, GABLED house

with dark, narrow passages and an overgrown garden, which Lewis and his brother Warren played in and explored together. There was also a library that was crammed with books. Two of Lewis' favorites were *Treasure Island* by Robert Louis Stevenson and *The Secret Garden* by Frances Hodgson Burnett.

This somewhat IDYLLIC boyhood came to an end after two tragic losses. First, his beloved family dog, Jacksie, died after being hit by a car and CS Lewis insisted on being called "Jacksie" although he eventually settled for "Jack." Then his mother became ill and died of cancer in 1908. Barely a month after her death the two boys were sent away from home to go to boarding school in ENGLAND. Lewis hated the school, with its strict rules and hard, unsympathetic headmaster, and he missed Belfast terribly. Fortunately for him, the school closed in 1910, and he was able to return to Ireland.

After one year back in Ireland, however, he was sent back to England to study again. This time, the experience proved to be mostly positive. As a teenager, Lewis learned to love POETRY, especially the works of VIRGIL and HOMER. He also developed an interest in modern languages, mastering French, German, and Italian.

As a boy, Lewis was fascinated with anthropomorphic animals; he was first inspired by the Tale of Peter Rabbit by Beatrix Potter and so he wrote and ILLUSTRATED his own animal stories. He and his brother created an entire world called BOXEN, filled with and run by animals. ANTHROPOMORPHISM, or personification, is when you attribute a human form or other characteristics to anything other than a human being. In children's literature, animals, such as Aslan in the Chronicles of Narnia, exhibit various levels of anthropomorphism, from talking or thinking like a human, to wearing clothes and riding bicycles.

**Spell: ILLUSTRATED PERSONIFICATION** Which story by Beatrix Potter inspired Jack's love of anthropomorphic animals? THE TALE OF PETER RABBIT What is the name for attributing a human form or other characteristic to something other than a human? ANTHROPOMORPHISM Give me an example of anthropomorphism. If you were an anthropomorphic animal which animal would you be? What human attributes would you have? Why?

### **Creative Writing:**

Each book, or chronicle, stands alone, but together they tell the entire history of a fantastic world that becomes as real as your own. A world of a magic and adventure—a place in which children's imaginations know no bounds. If you could walk through a magic wardrobe and come out into your own fantastic world, what would it be like? Who would be there? What would you do?
